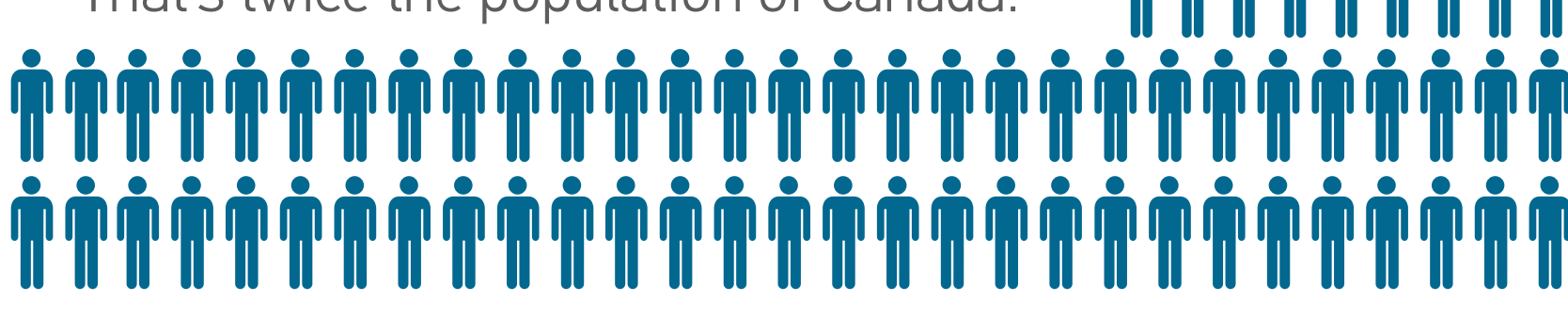
In 2011, Canadian RAIL moved \$372.3 billion revenue tonne kilometers

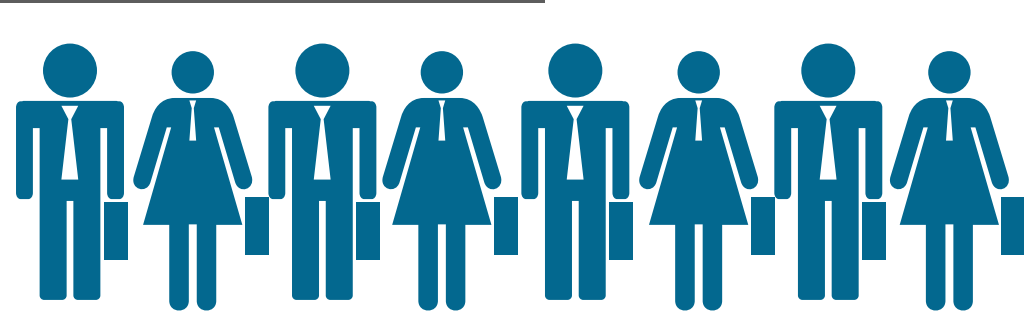
Canadian RAIL is hiring 15,000 new employees within five years. Five percent of top management will also retire in the next five years.

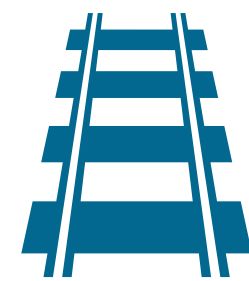

1,400 pounds of coal

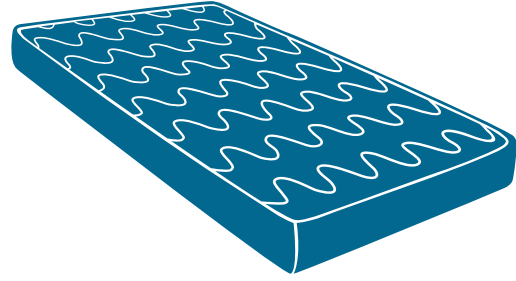


120 pounds of limestone

Recycle and reuse of RAIL steel optimizes the use of our planet's resources.

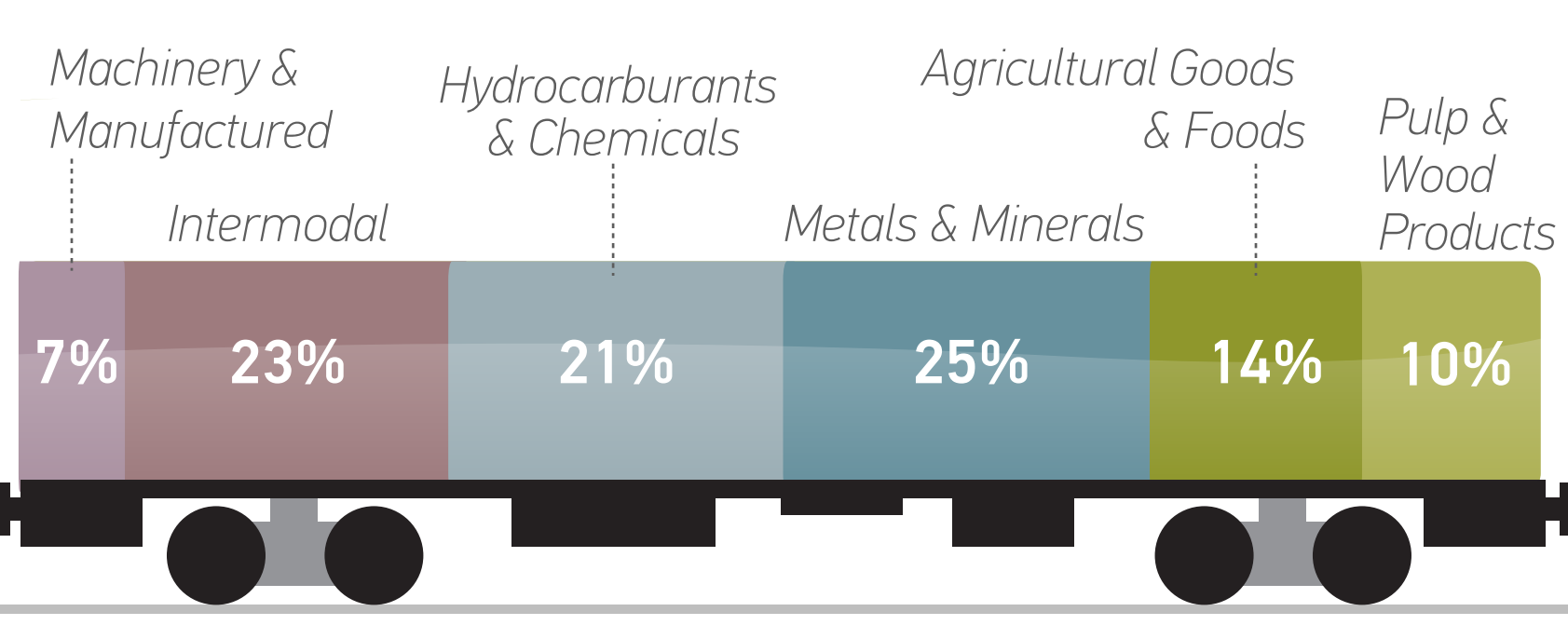


Your mattress frame may be made of recycled RAIL.
